

PUPIL PREMIUM STATEMENT 2016/17

Since April 2011, schools have been in receipt of Pupil Premium funding for each child who have claimed Free School Meals at any time during the past six years. Funding is also received if a child has been looked after or has been adopted from care or whose parents serve in the armed forces.

Effective use of the Pupil Premium Funding 2015/16

At Regents Park Community College students were supported in the following areas:

Results - August 2016

Year 11 P.P students at Regents Park performed extremely well in their GCSEs. Student progress is now judged by the Progress 8 performance measure. Our Year 11 P.P students achieved a Progress 8 score of 0.31, which is significantly above the performance of students nationally. In fact, in the open element of the Progress 8 figure (often choice subjects) our P.P students made so much progress they were ranked in the top 5% nationally.

A*-C in English & Maths PP students achieved 54% compared to 59% for all other students
A*-C in English Language PP students achieved 50% compared to 58% for all other students
A*-C in Maths PP students achieved 61% compared to 68% for all other students

Effective use of the Pupil Premium Funding 2016/17

For this academic year we are continuing the support strategies developed. Please see below a plan of the support:

£247,779

- ❖ £3000 will be allocated to reduce cost of trips or allow student to attend a trip
- ❖ £1000 will be allocated to reduce costs of uniform or PE kit
- ❖ £1000 will be allocated towards exam support
- ❖ £20000 will be allocated to revision and revision guides (including staffing and external support for students), breakfast clubs (currently Science & Maths) to enhance the students revision and coursework
- ❖ £100000 will be allocated for additional teachers (behaviour support) and project posts
- ❖ £62779 will be allocated for additional learning support staff and teaching staff to support our one to one tuition
- ❖ £60000 will be allocated for external support for one to one tuition
