‘Need energy caps’?

The Competition and Markets Authority (CMA) has come up with a price cap for households using pre-payment meters. This could mean that energy for households could be more affordable.

The CMA also proposed what could be the ending of the restriction on suppliers to offer just four tariffs. They follow an 18-month investigation into energy market, which found in total customers have been paying about £1.7bn a year more than they would in a competitive market.
